

Marshall County Conservation Board
Regular Meeting July 13, 2020
GrimesFarm and Conservation Center.....5:00 p.m.

President, Steve Armstrong called the regular meeting of the Marshall County Conservation Board to order on Monday, July 13 at GrimesFarm and Conservation Center at 5:02 p.m.

Board members present were Steve Armstrong, Pam Paone, Rich Naughton, Tom Deimerly, and Tom Mack. Staff present was Mike Stegmann, Jeremiah Manken, and Tami Krough. Public present was Julie Pickard.

Steve Salasek swore in new board member Tom Deimerly.

There were no changes to the agenda.

There were not corrections to the minutes of June 8 and there was one correction to the minutes of June 17, Paone's name was spelled incorrectly, they were declared approved with corrections.

On a motion by Mack, seconded by Paone, the Board approved the list of claims as presented with addendums. Voting in favor: Armstrong, Mack, Deimerly, Naughton, and Paone. Motion carried.

Stegmann asked for approval to make the expense for the armoring of the shoreline at Sand Lake which is part of a fish habitat grant. Total cost of the project is \$37,750 and is 90/10 cost share with MCCB's portion being \$3,755. The work is to be completed by Matt Husak. Paone moved to approve the expense for armoring the shoreline at Sand Lake. Mack seconded. Voting in favor: Armstrong, Mack, Deimerly, Naughton, and Paone. Motion carried.

Julie Pickard discussed with board the possible purchase of part of the Heart of Iowa trail.

Stegmann discussed the Conservation Center being closed and plans for reopening.

Non-action items: memorial monies from Artis Wansley, Green Castle, area maps, and the vacant maintenance position.

Meeting adjourned at 5:56 p.m.
