

Marshall County Conservation Board
Regular Meeting October 12, 2020

President, Steve Armstrong called the regular meeting of the Marshall County Conservation Board to order on Monday, October 12 at GrimesFarm and Conservation Center at 5:05 p.m.

Board members present were Steve Armstrong, Pam Paone, Rich Naughton, Tom Deimerly, and Tom Mack. Staff present was Mike Stegmann, Jeremiah Manken, Emily Herring and Tami Krough.

There were no changes to the agenda.

There was no corrections to the minutes of September 14, they were declared approved as presented.

On a motion by Mack, seconded by Deimerly, the Board approved the list of claims as presented with addendums. Voting in favor: Mack, Deimerly, Naughton, Armstrong and Paone. Motion carried.

Stegmann requested approval to submit a Fish Habitat Grant to the Iowa Department of Natural Resources for armoring the south shoreline at Sand Lake. Total cost of the project is \$37,075 with 90/10 cost share. Mack moved to approve the submittal of a Fish Habitat Grant to the IDNR for armoring the south shoreline at Sand Lake. Paone seconded. Voting in favor: Mack, Deimerly, Naughton, Armstrong and Paone. Motion carried.

No action item discussed: work on the playscape, Grammer Grove cleanup, Sand Lake cleanup, Furrow Access cleanup, hiring of someone to clean the Nature Center, Timmons shower house, and possible new joint position as weed commissioner.
